The umbrella site for digital images of Irish civil records, covering birth registrations more than 100 years old, marriage registrations more than 75 years old, and death registrations more than 50 years old. There is a “moving wall” whereby an extra year is added annually to each dataset. Access is free, and records may be printed.

*NB - digital images for death registrations 1864-1870 are not yet available.

The umbrella site for the National Archives of Ireland’s genealogical collection. Coverage includes digital images of the 1901 and 1911 census returns, the surviving fragments of the 19th century census returns, the Tithe Applotment Books, and the Valuation Office books. Access is free and the images may be printed.

Catholic parish registers at the NLI : the NLI’s all-Ireland collection of Catholic parish registers. An important source for pre-1864 births and marriages. Access is free, and the images may be printed, but unfortunately the entries are not indexed.
